

Courage to Act

Courage to Act is a multi-year national initiative to address and prevent gender-based violence (GBV) at post-secondary institutions (PSIs) in Canada led by Possibility Seeds.

It builds on key recommendations within Possibility Seeds' vital report "Courage to Act: Developing a National Framework to Address and Prevent Gender-Based Violence at Post-Secondary Institutions."

It is the first collaborative of its kind to bring together 170+ GBV experts and advocates from across Canada to address GBV on campus.



Framing the Issue




Phase 1: Listening

- 1. Increase awareness and application of tools, policies, and procedures through piloting, consultation, and community engagement;
- 2. **Improve knowledge and resources** on GBV prevention and intervention through new, innovative tools;
- 3. **Create two new evidence-based tools** on sexual harassment in experiental learning, and a community risk assessment on gender-based violence for PSIs;
- 4. Continue to build collaboration and capacity-building across PSIs through our National Skillshare Series and expansion of our Knowledge Centre.



Phase 3: Sexual Harassment in Experiential Learning Project

Students experience sexual harassment in internships, co-op, placements, etc.

No research or tools to address this issue





Phase 3 Impact - A Snapshot of the Last 5 Months

- **Alberta -** The Alberta government issued a directive to PSIs about their sexual violence policies, and named Courage to Act as a key resource to refer to.
- Nova Scotia Partnership with Antigonish Women's Centre & Sexual Assault Services to use our Student Organizers toolkit for their Waves of Change Bystander Intervention Program at PSIs across Nova Scotia.
- **Quebec** The Quebec government held a consultation with Quebec PSIs about sexual violence, and distributed a resource guide which included Courage to Act.
- **High School Too** We're advising the #HighSchoolToo movement students coast to coast are drawing on these resources to challenge high school sexual violence policies.
- Across Canada Tools are being piloted at universities and colleges across the country.
