I wanted to talk a little bit about the art style I use in this comic, as it's an interesting one for comics for sure.

As you've probably noticed, the colouring is splotty, grainy, and imperfect. It's intentionally done that way to pay homage to the origins of zine culture, something I really adore. Which is, in short, marginalized people not seeing themselves in publishing and creating self-published works that represented them. It was a way for marginalized people to share their voices, their stories, their passions and woes to the world without being hushed down. Which feels very aligned with speaking out against abuse and sharing one's story in my opinion. Zines are imperfect, and I think they're beautiful for that. I love their photocopied, messy and smudged looks. How sometimes they're a bit pixelated, but we love them all the same. Because self-published works like zines mean something to people! It means so much to us because sometimes, still to this day, we can't find works that speak to us about what we want to see in the world, and it's comforting to know that anybody and everybody can just...make a thing! And be that person to make that thing!

A lot of my imagery is pretty naive too, I really enjoy working in such a loose almost childish style of drawing, it makes the drawings feel like anybody could do this, draw and share your story through comics! It makes it less intimidating and more approachable. Something easy, simple, and clear to understand. As well, when drawing heavy content my simple drawings make it easier to feel okay. Personally, when drawing heavy subjects I don't want to ever visually depict actual violence, ever. So instead I draw my feelings and emotions surrounding these topics. There is no sense of time because of the lack of panel structures, which is something I always find interesting. It's fun to explore and experiment! I love it very much! It's also reassuring to make comics that are a bit "simple," just bucket tool dropping colours simple, and nice to know it never has to be "beautiful" because it's existence, our existence, is beautiful already.

That's about it! Thank you again for reading through this, I hope it keeps you safe and warm. I look forward to reading your comics into the future if you choose to make them! I will display them proudly in my bookshelf <3
