

You are a flower and I care for you not because you are beautiful, but because I appreciate you


I give myself a flower

In that comic I wrote that I was brave


In that comic I could say anything I wanted

It was the one place they could not silence me




And as more people read that comic

We would hold each other and cry




But we knew everytime we saw each other that we were alive

When I wasn't alone


It felt easier

And know I belong




I remember one survivor telling me that they read my zine so much it-

And knowing that there's a future for you




That things will shift and change

-I want you to write with hope




Know that when you draw the world is before you

You do not need to write trauma unless you feel


Comfortable with it

You can let yourself be free




Whatever freedom means to you

You are the most important




When you create, you create for yourself

You can become all powerful in your creations




You can create for yourself and nobody else

And you are moving forward




But you can also share and see what happens

It's all about growth




At the end of the day-

In luscious fields unafraid of the bugs


We watch the clouds

And I tell you that I love you



I love you


