## Sexual Harassment - What is a myth & what is reality?

Myths <sup>3</sup>	Realities
Sexual harassment is no big deal	It is a violation of human rights.
It is an invention of feminists	It is a violation of various federal, provincial/territorial and/or municipal legislations.
<ul><li>Women exaggerate the impacts</li><li>It's not like she was raped</li></ul>	
It is a "deviant" or rare event	Sexual harassment is a widespread problem.
<ul> <li>Men who harass must be perverse, ugly, sexually frustrated – not regular guys</li> <li>It only happens to women in male-dominated fields</li> </ul>	Anyone can be sexually harassed; however, subordinated groups (e.g. women, LGBTQ people, people with disabilities) are targeted more often.  Street harassment can be sexist, racist, transphobic, homophobic, ableist, sizeist and/or classist.
It is "normal" behaviour between sexes	It is not part of courtship; nor about unrequited love or romantic attraction.
It's innocent flirtation/sexual attraction	It is often used to express power over another person.
Women are being hyper- sensitive	It is discrimination.
He didn't mean to do it	Sexual harassment is intentional behaviour.
<ul> <li>He was having fun/drinking and got carried away</li> <li>He's a good guy/my friend/coworker</li> </ul>	Often, it re-asserts gender, race, age or class hierarchies within environments (school, work, street) in harmful ways.

Myths <sup>3</sup>	Realities
Stopping/reporting sexual harassment is easy	There are many barriers to reporting that silence women or lead them to minimize, ignore or "put up" with harassment.
<ul> <li>Women file reports lightly</li> <li>Women easily gain the upper hand by reporting</li> <li>She can verbally protest</li> <li>She can avoid harm if she wants to</li> </ul>	Sometimes reporting creates additional problems for victims: e.g. s/he may be ostracized by co-workers, not believed, or pay for being a "whistle-blower".
"Reactions" to sexual harassment are the real problem	Sexual harassment causes negative consequences (e.g. poor health, loss of earning potential).
<ul> <li>Results in political correctness</li> <li>Ruins "normal relationships"</li> <li>Stops people from having fun</li> </ul>	Its repercussions should never be blamed on the person being harassed.
<ul> <li>She asked for it</li> <li>She chose to work in a male environment</li> <li>She wears sexy clothes</li> </ul>	Everyone has the right to learn, work and be in settings free from discrimination.
